Rules and Regulations:

- Everyone is welcome to submit entries. Entries are not limited to Garden Club Members. **There Are No Entry Fees.**
- Each entrant is responsible for completing his/her own exhibitor cards before dropping off entries. Exhibitor Cards may be picked up at KGC Monthly meetings or can be requested by e-mail: KelownaGCFlowerShow@gmail.com. Exhibitor cards will be available at the Entry Table drop off for non-members if necessary.
- **There is no limit to the number of classes entered.**
Note: only one entry per class permitted.
- Entries will be accepted between 8am and 9am. All entries will be placed in the Show Tent by a Show Clerk in the correct Class. Entries must not be removed until 3:00pm.
- All flowers must be **from the exhibitor's garden.** Purchased flowers may be used only where stated in specific classes.
- All exhibits are shown at the exhibitor's risk. The Show Organizers are not responsible for loss or damage. Make sure your name and phone number are on the bottom of each of your containers.
- Judging will begin at 9:30am. Judges will consider the entries as seen at the time of judging and the judges' decision will be final.
- Ribbons will be given for first, second, and third in each class, if the judges feel such awards are warranted. Category winners will receive awards and rosettes.
- A trophy is awarded to the aggregate winner. The winner's name will be engraved on the trophy, and the winner will receive an engraved medallion as a keepsake.

**Judging will be done in accordance with the
BC Council of Garden Clubs' Judging Standards.**

The Greenery

CATEGORY 1 – BENCH - CUT FLOWERS

- If entry calls for a single bloom, **all side buds must be removed**
- Flowers must have a stem with its own foliage, unless otherwise stated.
- Vases will be available for Classes 1 thru 5 if needed.
- Heavy flowers on a long stem must be placed in a heavy container.
- All roses and cut flowers should be named if possible

- Class 1 Hybrid tea rose – one bloom, two thirds to three quarters open with own foliage, RED OR PINK.
- Class 2 Hybrid tea rose – one bloom, two thirds to three quarters open, with own foliage. Any colour except Red or Pink.
- Class 3 Floribunda rose - one spray, any colour.
- Class 4 Miniature rose - one bloom, any colour.
- Class 5 Miniature roses – three miniature blooms, may be different colours.
- Class 6 Most Fragrant Rose– a single rose in a bowl that has been covered with plastic to hold the aroma.
- Class 7 Perennials – 3 different perennials with their own foliage arranged together in a vase.
- Class 8 Begonia- one bloom, any colour, floating in a shallow dish of water.
- Class 9 Clematis – one single bloom with its own foliage.
- Class 10 Shasta Daisies – any type, five stems of the same variety.
- Class 11 Lavender – Ten stems in a suitable container.
- Class 12 Delphinium - one stem, any colour, for the Jill Reid Delphinium Cup.
- Class 13 One Flowering Branch of a shrub or tree, no taller than 75 cm (30”).
- Class 14 Liliium - One stem, multiple blooms, any colour of the true lily (Liliium) for the Lily Trophy placed in a heavy container.
- Class 15 Open Class – Any flower not included in the above classes, with or without its own foliage.

CATEGORY 2 – EXHIBITS - (FLORAL ART) - THEME – Passion for Purple COLOUR OF THE YEAR– Purple

- Class 16 Fabulous Foliage – an exhibit of different kinds of foliage.
- Class 17 Passionate about Purple – a monochromatic exhibit of flowers in shades of purple with your choice of greenery.
- Class 18 A Bouquet of Roses – an exhibit of various roses with any foliage.
- Class 19 Tea Time – an exhibit of flowers and greenery in a tea cup and saucer.
- Class 20 Name that Song – An arrangement representing a song title. Accessories allowed. Please name your song.
- Class 21 Used But Not Forgotten – an exhibit of flowers and greenery in a recycled container.
- Class 22 Hydrangea Bouquet – an exhibit featuring hydrangeas and greenery; may include other flowers.
- Class 23 Oriental Simplicity – an exhibit of up to 3 flowers with greenery which may be purchased. Accessories allowed.

- Class 24 Let's Get Started – A large exhibit of summer flowers and greenery by a Novice Exhibitor. (A novice exhibitor is a person who has never won a blue ribbon in a flower show).
- Class 25 Woven Wonders – an exhibit of flowers in a basket. May include foliage and grasses.

CATEGORY 3 – POTTED PLANTS /CONTAINERS

All entries should be planted in a light weight easy to lift container.

- Class 26 Tasty Herbs – a variety of three to six different culinary herbs planted in a container and labelled. Maximum of six plants.
- Class 27 Enchanted Garden – a miniature garden of small plants in a shallow container. May include small figures and accessories.
- Class 28 Can be Prickly – an assortment of cacti and/or succulents of any kind in a shallow planter. Accessories allowed.
- Class 29 Patio Party– Small patio container featuring Purple, the colour of the Year. Accessories allowed.
- Class 30 Look What I Found! Small objects found in nature displayed together with small plants in a shallow container.
- Class 31 Garden Bounty – A minimum of 3 edible plants to a maximum of six plants potted in a suitable container. May include vegetables, fruit and/or edible flowers. Accessories allowed.
- Class 32 Vibrant colours – an exhibit of vibrantly coloured flowers and greenery potted in a **hanging basket**.
- Class 33 Home Sweet Home – Your favourite house plant, small to medium.
- Class 34 Dreaming of the Tropics – an arrangement of small tropical plants, which may be purchased, potted in a container. Accessories allowed.

CHILDREN'S CATEGORY (UP to 12 years of age, cash prizes)

- Class 35 Child's Creation – a container of potted plants grown by a child.
- Class 36 Flower Garden – an exhibit of cut flowers and greenery exhibited in a container chosen by child exhibitor.

FLORAL TERMS

Exhibit: - An exhibit is made of plant material with a base if necessary, with or without accessories. Plant material must predominate over all components of the exhibit. (Floral Art)

Accessory: - Any item other than fresh cut plant material which accents or adds feeling to the theme or purpose the arranger is interpreting. Accessories can be used only if stated in the schedule.

Spray: - a stem with a cluster of blooms (floreescence). A spray should have 3 or more open blooms. Note, a bud is not a bloom.

Stem:- The major supporting part of a plant to which buds, leaves and flowers are attached.
