**Rules and Regulations:**

- Everyone is welcome to submit entries. Entries are not limited to Garden Club Members. **There Are No Entry Fees**
- Each entrant is responsible for completing his/her own exhibitor cards
- **There is no limit to the number of classes entered; note: only one entry per class permitted**
- Entries will be accepted between 8am to 9am. All entries must be in place by 9:00am and must not be removed until 3:00pm. All entries will be placed by a Show Clerk in the correct class
- The only flowers that may be purchased are those as stated in specific categories. All other flowers must be from the exhibitor's garden
- All exhibits are shown at the exhibitor's risk. The Show Organizers are not responsible for loss or damage. Make sure your name and phone number are on the bottom of each of your containers
- **Vases will be provided for Classes 1 thru 4, and must be used.**
- Judging will begin at 9:30am. Judges will consider the entries as seen when judged and the judges' decision will be final
- Ribbons will be given for first, second, and third in each class, if the judges feel such awards are warranted. Category winners will receive awards and rosettes.
- A trophy is awarded to the aggregate winner. The Winner's name will be engraved on the trophy, and the winner will receive a [rosette](#) and engraved medallion as a keepsake.

**Judging will be done in accordance with the BC Council of Garden Clubs' Judging Standards.**

## CATEGORY 1 – BENCH - CUT FLOWERS

- If entry calls for a single bloom, **all side buds must be removed.** Flowers must have a stem with its own foliage, unless otherwise stated.
- All roses and cut flowers should be named if possible.
- All entries should be displayed in **an easily carried container.** Please consider shallow containers.

- Class 1 Hybrid tea rose - one bloom, RED.  
Class 2 Hybrid tea rose - one bloom, PINK.  
Class 3 Hybrid tea rose – one bloom, YELLOW OR APRICOT.  
Class 4 Floribunda rose - one spray, any colour.  
Class 5 Miniature rose - one bloom, any colour.  
Class 6 Miniature rose - one spray, any colour, (in an appropriate container).  
Class 7 Miniature rose – three miniature blooms, may be different colours.  
Class 8 Pelargonium (Geranium) – Three stems, any type, any colour displayed in a suitable vase.  
Class 9 Begonia – One bloom without foliage, displayed in a shallow dish.  
Class 10 Clematis - one single bloom with its own greenery.  
Class 11 Shasta Daisies – any type, five stems of the same variety.  
Class 12 Lavender – Ten stems in a suitable container.  
Class 13 Hydrangea – One stem, any colour with greenery.  
Class 14 Delphinium - one spike, any colour for the Jill Reid Delphinium Cup.  
Class 15 Lilium - One stem, multiple blooms, any colour of the true lily (Lilium) for the Lily Trophy.  
Class 16 Open Class – any perennial from your garden not included in the above classes, with or without greenery.

## CATEGORY 2 – EXHIBITS - (FLORAL ART)

THEME – Year of the Garden and  
Kelowna Garden Club 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

- Class 17 Fabulous Foliage – an exhibit of different kinds of greenery.  
Class 18 Colour it Red – a monochromatic exhibit of flowers in shades of red, with choice of greenery, in honour of the “Colour of the Year – Red”.  
Class 19 A Bouquet of Roses – an exhibit of various roses with own foliage and other greenery.  
Class 20 Tea in the Garden – an exhibit of flowers and greenery in a tea pot.  
Class 21 Cuppa Tea? – an exhibit of flowers and greenery in a tea cup and saucer.  
Class 22 Tiny Treasures – Two side by side, identical exhibits with a variety of flowers and greenery. Each exhibit not exceeding 8cm in height and width.

- Class 23 Hydrangea bouquet – an exhibit featuring hydrangeas and greenery, may include other flowers.  
Class 24 Silver Anniversary - predominantly red flowers with a choice of silver foliage.  
Class 25 Oriental Simplicity – an exhibit of up to three flowers, with greenery. Plant material may be purchased. Accessories allowed.  
Class 26 Summer in the Garden – A large exhibit of flowers and greenery.  
Class 27 Woven wonders – an exhibit of flowers in a basket. May include foliage and grasses. Must be able to lift basket by the handle.  
Class 28 Farm to Table – an exhibit of vegetables and flowers in any container. Vegetables may be purchased.

## CATEGORY 3 – POTTED PLANTS /CONTAINERS

- Class 29 Tasty Herbs – a variety of three to six named culinary herbs potted in a food themed container.  
Class 30 Enchanted Garden – a miniature garden using small plants and greenery in a shallow container. May include accessories, fairies and/or gnomes.  
Class 31 Can be prickly – an assortment of cacti and/or succulents of any kind in a shallow container. Accessories allowed.  
Class 32 Patio Party– Small patio container featuring colour of the year, red.  
Class 33 Garden Bounty – A minimum of 3 edible plants potted in a suitable container, may include vegetables, fruit and/or edible flowers.  
Class 34 Vibrant colours – an exhibit of vibrantly potted coloured flowers and greenery.

## CATEGORY 4 – CHILDREN'S (UP to 12 years of age, cash prizes)

- Class 35 Child's Creation – a container of potted plants grown by a child.  
Class 36 Flower Garden – an exhibit of cut flowers and greenery exhibited in a container chosen by child exhibitor.

### FLORAL TERMS

*Exhibit:* An exhibit is made of plant material with a base if necessary, with or without accessories. Plant material must predominate over all components of the exhibit (Floral Art)

*Accessory:* Any item other than fresh cut plant material which accents or adds feeling to the theme or purpose the arranger is interpreting. Accessories can be used only if stated in the schedule.

*Spray:* a stem with a cluster of blooms (florescence). A spray should have at least 3 or more open blooms. Note, a bud is not a bloom.

*Stem:* The major supporting part of a plant to which buds, leaves, and flowers are attached.
