

## CATEGORY 1 – BENCH - CUT FLOWERS

- If entry calls for a single bloom, **all side buds must be removed.** Flowers must have a stem with its own foliage, unless otherwise stated.
- All roses and cut flowers should be named if possible.
- All rose entries in classes 1 to 8 to be displayed in clear vases, provided by Kelowna Garden Club.

- Class 1 Hybrid tea rose, one bloom –RED  
Class 2 Hybrid tea rose, one bloom –PINK  
Class 3. Hybrid tea rose, one bloom –YELLOW OR APRICOT  
Class 4 Hybrid tea rose, one bloom - ANY OTHER COLOUR(S) NOT LISTED  
Class 5 Open Class, any rose, one STEM – ANY COLOUR(S)  
Class 6 Floribunda rose, one spray, any colour  
Class 7 Miniature rose, one bloom, any colour  
Class 8 Miniature rose, one spray, any colour  
Class 9 Most fragrant rose, without foliage (in a rose bowl covered with plastic wrap)  
Class 10 Pelargonium (Geranium) - Three stems, any type, any colour, displayed in a suitable vase  
Class 11 Sweet William - 3 stems, any colour(s)  
Class 12 Delphinium - 1 spike, any colour (use heavy container for stability)  
Class 13 Begonia - 1 bloom without foliage, displayed in a shallow dish  
Class 14 Clematis - one single bloom with its own foliage  
Class 15 Liliium - 1 stem, any type (use heavy container for stability)  
Class 16 Shasta Daisies - any type, 5 stems of the same variety  
Class 17 Perennials - 3 varieties, 1 stem each  
Class 18 Hydrangea – 1 stem, any colour with foliage  
Class 19 Lavender - 10 stems in a suitable container  
Class 20 Open Class – an interesting or unusual flower from your garden not included in the above classes, with or without foliage

## CATEGORY 2 – EXHIBITS - (FLORAL ART)

### THEME – Kaleidoscope of Colour

- Class 21 Kaleidoscope - a large colourful exhibit of perennial flowers and greenery.  
Class 22 Tea Time – an exhibit of flowers and greenery in a tea cup and saucer.  
Class 23 Invitation to Tea – an exhibit of annual flowers and greenery in a teapot.  
Class 24 Colour it Beautiful - a monochromatic exhibit of flowers which must be shades of one color or hue only, with greenery.  
Class 25 Sophisticated Simplicity – an exhibit of up to 3 flowers and any kind of foliage which may be purchased. Accessories allowed.  
Class 26 Smell the Roses – an exhibit of various tea roses with own foliage and other greenery.

- Class 27 Year of the Hydrangea - A bouquet (or exhibit) featuring Hydrangeas and greenery in a vase. May include other flowers.  
Class 28 Psychedelic Shock- an exhibit of vibrantly coloured flowers and greenery.  
Class 29 Name that Song – an exhibit representing a song title. Accessories allowed. Song must be named.  
Class 30 Woven Wonders – an exhibit of flowers in a basket. May include foliage, and grasses. Must be able to lift basket by handle.  
Class 31 Down the Garden Path – an exhibit of flowers, vegetables and/or fruit which may be purchased. May also include foliage and grasses.  
Class 32 Little Beauties – an exhibit of miniature roses and greenery.

## CATEGORY 3 – POTTED PLANTS /PLANTERS

- Class 33 Okanagan Vista – an exhibit using plants, wood, rocks, water, grasses and/or greenery, in a low container. Accessories allowed.  
Class 34 Enchanted Garden – a miniature garden using small plants and greenery. May include fairies and/or gnomes and accessories  
Class 35 Tasty Herbs – a variety of at least 5 different herbs planted in a suitable container. Herbs must be named.  
Class 36 Okanagan Kaleidoscope – a patio container featuring an assortment of plants and flowers with a colourful theme. Accessories allowed.  
Class 37 Garden Bounty - a patio container garden, with at least 3 edible plants, may include vegetables, fruit and/or edible flowers. Accessories allowed.  
Class 38 Scintillating Succulents – an assortment of succulents of any kind in a suitable planter container. May include cacti and accessories.

## CHILDREN'S CATEGORY (Up to 12 years of age, cash prizes)

- Class 39 Toy Shop – an exhibit of cut flowers and greenery in a toy.  
Class 40 Child's Creation – a container of Potted Plants grown by the child.

### FLORAL TERMS

**Exhibit: - An exhibit is made of plant material with a base if necessary, with or without accessories. Plant material must predominate over all components of the exhibit. (Floral Art)**

**Accessory: - Any item other than fresh cut plant material which accents or adds feeling to the theme or purpose the arranger is interpreting. Accessories can only be used if stated in the schedule.**

**Spray: - a stem with a cluster of blooms (florescence). A spray should have at least 3 or more open blooms. Note, a bud is not a bloom.**

**Stem: - The major supporting part of a plant to which buds, leaves and flowers are attached.**

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **Everyone is welcome to submit entries.** Entries are not limited to garden club members. **THERE ARE NO ENTRY FEES.**
- Each entrant is responsible for completing his/her own exhibitor's cards.
- **There is no limit to the number of classes entered; note: only one entry per class permitted.**
- Entries will be accepted between 8:00 am and 9:00 am. All entries must be in place by 9:15 am and must not be removed until 3:00 pm.
- Containers will be provided for rose classes 1 to 8, and must be used. All entries will be placed by a show clerk in the correct class.
- The only flowers that may be purchased are those as stated in specific categories. All other flowers must be from the exhibitor's garden.
- All exhibits are shown at the exhibitor's risk. The Show Organizers are not responsible for loss or damage. Make sure your name and phone number are on the bottom of each of your containers.
- Judging will begin at 9:30 am. Judges will consider the entries as seen when judged and the judges' decision will be final.
- Ribbons will be given for first, second, and third in each class, if the judges feel such awards are warranted. Category winners will receive awards and rosettes.
- A trophy is awarded to the aggregate winner.
- The Awards Ceremony and presentations will be held at 2:30 pm.

**Judging will be done in accordance with the BC Council of Garden Clubs' Judging Standards.**
